Read 1 Peter

Read the book of 1 Peter out loud. Draw a simple clock beside any passage about eternity or heaven.



God's Clock What do the following passages teach us about God's view of time?

Past: Isaiah 43:25, Philippians 3:13-14

Present: Matthew 6:25-34

Future: James 4:13-16

Eternity: Isaiah 45:17. Isaiah 57:15

Counting the Days Read Psalm 90. This "A Prayer of Moses" is thought to be one of the oldest Psalms in the Bible. Ironically, it gives us a unique perspective on time.

- Compare Psalm 90:4 and 2 Peter 3:8. How does this compare to your view of time, waiting, patience and eternity?
- Memorize and meditate on Psalm 90:12. If we fully realized the brevity of our days, how do you think we would live differently?

The Greatest Read Luke 9:46-48. How much of the stress in your home is caused by people battling for the top position of greatness?

- How can you be "least" in your home? Does taking the "least" position frighten you?
- Conduct an experiment for one day in your home by treating others as more important than yourself. Trust God with the outcome. This experiment will make you greatest in the kingdom if not in your own kitchen!

The Best Read about Peter and Paul's conflicts in Acts 10, Acts 15, and Galatians 2.

- Do you struggle like Peter at accepting people right where they are, "unclean and impure" as they may be? Have you ever seen someone rejected by so-called "religious" people because they hadn't cleaned up their act? How do you react to people who are different from you?
